What are New England sectors?

- Cooperative catch share system
- Voluntary, self-selecting groups of fishermen organized into groups called sectors
- Each sector allocated percentage of the ACL based on catch history if its members (note this is not allocated to the individual permit holder)
- Over 95 percent of catch occurs in sectors
- Not a LAPP or ITQ because NMFS said so and a judge agreed

Development (1)

- First authorized in 2004
 - Mitigation from effort control measures
 - Self-governance
 - Consolidation
 - Quid pro quo: no effort controls but increased management responsibilities

Development (2)

- Expanded in 2010
 - Address bycatch issues;
 - Simplify management;
 - Give industry greater control over their own fate;
 - Provide a mechanism for economics to shape the fleet rather than regulations(while working to achieve fishing and biomass targets); and
 - Prevent excessive consolidation that would eliminate the day boat fishery

Performance Standards

- Council:
 - Operations plan development
 - Enforcement of operations plans provisions
 - Monitoring standards
 - Weekly reporting requirement
 - Annual reporting requirement
 - Catch monitoring
- NMFS/GARFO
 - Administrative requirements

Roles and Responsibilities

- Council
 - Establish and adjust program
 - Initial approval of individual sectors
- NMFS/GARFO
 - Approve program, ops plans, exemption requests
 - Sector support
- Sectors
 - Identify operations
 - Monitor catch
 - Enforce compliance with sector rules

Co-Management Examples

- Vessel logbook compliance
- Fishing location issues
- Response to court order on allocation carry-over
- Pooling of quota within sectors
- Right of First Refusal

Challenges

- Co-management with who?
- Monitoring
 - Data confidentiality
 - Internal sector operations
- Administrative burden
- Shifting enforcement dynamic
- Evolution
